In November, families and administrators from 89 ECSD school communities, including ours, gathered for this school year's Community of School Councils engagement. Families shared what matters most in four areas that will guide the next Division Plan for Continuous Growth. They told us that belonging and visible faith are important, that they value consistent, engaging teaching practices across classrooms and schools, that access to mental health supports matters, and that classrooms need strong supports for diverse learning needs. WHAT PARENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT PRIVACY & SECURITY SETTINGS

Through out the year, themes will be highlighted monthly to support your child's journey as a digital citizenship. Join them as a partner in their education navigating the digital world!



What is Important About Privacy and Security?

Privacy and security online become more complex as children start exploring social media, messaging, and a wider range of websites and apps. They are developing independence but may not fully understand the long-term effects of their digital footprint or how to spot scams and unsafe behaviors online. At this age, it's crucial to teach them how to protect their personal information, recognize secure platforms, and interact respectfully with others in digital spaces.



Privacy & Security Tips for Parents



Discuss Personal Information and Privacy Settings

- Explain the importance of keeping personal information private, like their full name, phone number, address, and school name. Show them how to use privacy settings on apps and websites to control who sees their posts and information.

Teach About Digital Footprints

- Help your child understand that everything they post online leaves a trail, or "digital footprint." Encourage them to think carefully before sharing photos, comments, or personal details by asking, "Would I be okay with my teacher or future employer seeing this?"

Guide Social Media Use

- If they use social media or messaging apps, review the rules together. Emphasize respectful and kind communication and the importance of only connecting with people they know in real life.

Promote Strong Password Practices

- Help your child create strong passwords using a mix of letters, numbers, and symbols. Teach them not to reuse passwords across sites and to keep passwords private, even from friends.

Help Identify Safe Websites and Apps

- Teach your child how to evaluate websites and apps for safety, including checking age ratings and avoiding platforms that ask for unnecessary personal information. Explore safe, age-appropriate platforms together.

Discuss Photo Sharing and Consent

- Set rules for sharing photos, such as not including private details (like their location) and asking for permission before sharing photos of others.

Prepare Them to Spot Scams

- Teach your child to recognize phishing attempts, like emails or messages that promise prizes or ask for personal information. Encourage them to ask you if they're unsure about a link or message.

Encourage Open Communication

- Create a safe space for your child to talk about their online experiences. Reassure them that they can come to you if they encounter anything upsetting, confusing, or unsafe.

Illness Prevention

The health, safety, and well-being of our students and staff remain our top priority. Please continue to monitor your child for symptoms daily before coming to school. This is one of the most effective ways to prevent the spread of illness.

Anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of illness, including fever, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, new or worsening cough, or shortness of breath, should remain at home until their symptoms have improved and they have been free of fever for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication, and they feel well enough to resume normal activities. If your child becomes sick at school, parents/guardians will be called to pick them up. If your child is away from school for any reason, please call the office.




As the weather turns colder, please send your child/children to school dressed for outdoor weather. Students will be outdoors unless the temperature falls below -20C.
